# Important Information

## <u>English</u>

We will be using traditional fairy tales as a stimulus for our writing activities this term. We aim to cover a variety of texts, including news reports, story writing and argument writing.

There will also be a stronger emphasis on English skills, including handwriting and grammar.

Reading is also being highlighted more within the new national curriculum - especially reading aloud. As a result, we will be focussing on presentation skills and performance of poetry this term.

### <u>Maths</u>

During this term we will cover all aspects of mathematics, in line with the new National Curriculum. We will be paying special attention to our basic facts, including multiplication and division, to ensure that your child has the foundation to tackle harder concepts. We will continue to deliver maths across the curriculum so that your children are exposed to maths within a context.

We will also be practising SATS on a regular basis throughout the year to ensure the children are comfortable with testing procedures and formats.

### <u>Homework</u>

Homework will be given once a week and is expected to be handed in <u>completed</u> on a Friday. This will include spellings, maths, writing and reading. It is expected that children will be reading **most days**- out loud, when possible. I plan homework during the week as I believe weekends should be for making memorable moments with your families.

It would be wonderful if the children could practise times tables, as we will be working on rapid recall and it is essential that they know them inside out in order to access the harder concepts.

I try to cater the homework activities to your child's ability, however, if you feel that it is too challenging, or too easy, please feel free to come and see me.

I thank you in advance for all the hard work you will put into helping your child with their homework.

## <u>P.E</u>

P.E will be on <u>Tuesdays</u> and <u>Fridays</u>. Please ensure that your children have the correct P.E kit stipulated in the uniform policy. Can you please ensure that their uniforms are labelled and that this does not wash off over time.

The focus this term will be basketball and dance.

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### <u>History</u>

We will be looking at the chronological order of time periods and creating a time line to represent this.

We will be also looking at ancient history, how civilisations were established and how their lives differed from ours today.

## <u>Music</u>

Brass will now be on a <u>Wednesday</u> so please ensure that your child brings their instrument.

We will also be looking at group performance with voice and instruments and learning about how to read simple notation and identify the time signature of a song.

### <u>Computing</u>

As technologies advance, it is essential that children are properly educated in using them in a safe manner. As this is so, we will be having a focus on e-safety this term.

We will also be using rapid router, which is a programming software that provides the children with progressive activities that eventually lead to python programming language.

### <u>Science</u>

This term we will be studying materials. We will be identifying the states of matter and how this changes due to the application of energy. We will look at a variety of different energy sources and discuss whether the change is reversible or irreversible.

### <u>Geography</u>

We will be developing our own knowledge of maps, including how to identify features using a key; world Geography; and looking at some human and physical geographical features of major cities over a span of different continents.

### <u>Art</u>

This term, we will be focussing on our basic art skills of drawing and colour using a variety of stimuli including Pablo Picasso.

## <u>Modern Foreign Languages</u>

We will continue to study Spanish as our main language and will be covering a range of basic conversational phrases, with opportunities to progress to writing.

### <u>R.E.</u>

Our topics for this term are: Domestic church: family/loving Baptism/ Confirmation: vocations Advent/ Christmas: Loving, expectations.

It would be wonderful if you could encourage your children to talk about their faith at home and let them explore their ideas.

Last year, we were very lucky to have Mrs Wilson come in a deliver the Mini Vinnies programme. This will be continuing again this year and will be on a Tuesday after school.

As we had such a great response last year, we will be sending home the Advent bags again. There will also be the annual carol concert. It is an expectation that all children are to be involved in this.

This term, we will be linking our DT to our writing topic and our materials topic. We will be focussing on textiles and creating our own puppets to use in order to do a performance of a twisted version of a fairy tale, retold by the children themselves.
