# **Rights Respecting School Award**

In February 2017 we achieved the UNICEF UK Rights Respecting School Award for Recognition of Commitment.

# <u>Holidays:</u>

#### Names in clothes:

As you will realise, it can be a great problem identifying which clothes belong to who when the children all wear uniform. PLEASE put names in your children's clothes, coats & on their book bags.

#### Money in school:

Please remember to put any money sent into school in an envelope clearly marked with your child's name and what the money is for. Dinner money should be sent into school on a Monday, with correct amount of money if possible please -  $\pounds 10.00$ .

The Government have still tightened the rules concerning taking leave of absence in term time. The head teacher is only allowed to arant any 'leave of absence' in

The head teacher is only allowed to grant any 'leave of absence' in "<u>exceptional circumstances"</u>, and these can <u>only</u> be very exceptional circumstances.

PLEASE be aware of the law when planning holidays in the future.

Please note: NO absences will be authorised in May. This is an important

assessment time, including Y6 SATs, and pupils must not miss work at this point. Year 2 pupils will also be required to be assessed during May.

SATS week is from Monday 14th May-18th May

#### Haircuts:

Governors agreed that the school policy would be—only appropriate haircuts for school should be permitted. This means no patterns to be shaved into heads – this includes the 'v' shape that is shaved down the back of children's heads.

#### Packed Lunch Policy

Our packed lunch policy is in place. No crisps (except baked crisps) and **no** chocolate or sweets will be allowed. There should be no chocolate yoghurts or anything else containing chocolate. A piece of cake or 2 biscuits is allowed. There are lots of alternatives to crisps such as bread sticks, crackers etc.

A copy of the policy will soon be added to the website. One is held in the school office if you would like a copy, or if you need to speak to us about this, please don't hesitate to contact school.



#### Jewellery: Reminder

Governors agreed that the school policy would be that NO jewellery is allowed to be worn in school for health & safety reasons. Children will be asked to remove any & it will be kept safe for a parent to collect. In the case of earrings, parents will be asked to come down to school to remove the earrings if a child is unable to do this themselves.

This is also the case for any make-up, nail varnish or heels.

#### Medication:

No medication is allowed in school unless it has been prescribed by a doctor and must be taken 4 times per day or more. If this is the case, an adult must bring the medicine to school & collect it, and must fill in a medication form at the office.

<u>Dogs:</u>

No dogs on school premises please.



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#### Absence:

If your child is going to be absent, please inform

school before 9.30am so that we know that they are safe.



#### <u>Birthdays</u>

The staff are happy to hand out cake for children's birthdays but could you please send in individual small cakes or biscuits as sharing out big cakes can be quite challenging.
