
If your child has PE on a Monday, please send your child to school in school uniform, with a PE kit in a bag.

Roasting & You tube

I would like to draw your attention to an issue that has arisen in school this week. It has become evident that a number of our children have been watching "roasting" videos on You Tube.

"A roast is a form of humour in which a specific individual, a guest of honour, is subjected to jokes at their expense, intended to amuse the event's wider audience."

The humour used in these videos, is adult humour, and inappropriate for children. However, some children have been repeating these "roasts" in school. The words used are offensive and we have spent time this week, explaining to children:

- how inappropriate the roasts are
- that children should not be exploring You Tube freely without supervision
- and that we should not be using words and language when we do not know what they mean

In Class 2 in the coming week, I will be delivering a session on discrimination as a result of the inappropriate nature of the incidents referred to above.

For those of you who allow your children to access You Tube, please monitor what they are being exposed to. Thank you for your support in this matter.
