# **Our School Day**



Our school has a pupils admission number of 15, and we cater for pupils between the ages of 4 and 11. The children are taught in mixed ability year groups.

- Foundation Stage Reception
- Key Stage 1 Pupils aged 5 to 7 years old
- Key Stage 2 Pupils aged 7 to 11 years old

Our School day runs from 8.55 am - 3.00 pm (gates open 8.45 am).



We run a highly successful and well attended Breakfast Club.

Children can be dropped off from 7:45 am and breakfast is served until 8:30 am. The cost is currently £2.00 per child.

#### **Our Uniform**

School Uniform Requirements:

- Red sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan
- White shirt/blouse or white polo shirt
- Black school shoes with flat heels, not trainers
- Grey shorts or long trousers
- Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers
- · Summer dress red and white check.

In extreme weather, wellington boots can be worn. Children are asked to bring a change of shoes. We ask that all uniform, coats, PE kits etc. are labelled with your child's name. Preloved uniform is available please contact the school office.



### PE Requirements:

- Black shorts
- Plain white t-shirt (available with logo from school office)
- Black plimsolls (or trainers if outdoor PE)

#### If outdoors:

- Plain white t-shirt (as above)
- Joggers plain, either navy or black
- Hoody or tracksuit top, plain, either navy or black

# **Our Curriculum**



We aim to provide exciting learning experiences for our pupils and to bring learning alive by giving it a purpose. As a school, we want to grow children who are independently motivated to learn.

Our committed teachers and support staff strive to bring out the best in our children and equip them with skills for the future. We have consistently high expectations of all our pupils and ourselves, and we work hard together as a school community to provide the best learning opportunities for our children.

Our shared school motto is, "Whatever we do, we do it well."

The National Curriculum core subjects are:

The other Foundation subjects are Design and Technology, Geography, Art & Design, Music, PE, Modern Foreign Language and Personal Social Health and Emotional (PSHE).

# Pastoral support



### Wellbeing

At St. Godric's the Senior Mental Health Lead works closely with the Mental Health Support Team, also known as the Piece of Mind Team. Collectively with the support of specialist agencies, we can offer confidential and non-judgmental support and advice to children who attend our school.

All staff at St. Godric's work hard to ensure that our pupils have a sense of belonging within our school community and that is extended to their families too.

### **SEND**

Every child is a unique gift from God with his/her individual needs and gifts. Our school works in partnership with parents, to ensure these needs are identified and plans developed to meet them.

#### **Behaviour**

The school has a behaviour and anti-bullying policy. We are enormously proud of how the children behave both in and out of school. We appreciate the parents' partnership in maintaining these high standards.

### **Safeguarding**

We work hard at St. Godric's to promote a safeguarding culture throughout our school. All school staff have undertaken training in child protection and designated Safeguarding Officers are in place. We aim to support our pupils so that they feel safe and know who they can talk to, when they do not feel safe.

As a school we work closely with Bishop Chadwick Catholic Education Trust and a safeguarding consultant from Clennell Education Solutions. We follow the guidance of 'Keeping Children Safe in Education' 2016. We are constantly updating our safeguarding procedures in making our school as safe and secure environment for all. All staff are DBS checked before they can work in school. All visitors to school must sign in, in the main entrance, and only staff are permitted to gain access.



# **Our Community**



We have close links to the parish community and often invite the parish into our school to participate in mass with the children, as well as taking the children to the church.

Our parish priest, Father Ian, is on the Governing Body and often visits school to join our celebrations and to talk to the children about the Catholic faith.





Links with the community are very important to our school family.

We are always keen to involve ourselves in projects within Wheatley Hill and Thornley.

We have an active **Friends of the School** group who organise events for our pupils to enjoy as well as organising fundraising events.

They are always looking for new members and welcome new faces.



# **Chadwick's Kitchen**





Our award winning in-house catering team Chadwick's Kitchen, provide catering services across the Trust.

We use fresh ingredients to prepare healthy and nutritionally balanced meals each day. The majority of our menus are homemade by our chefs in our kitchens.

Staff are trained to accommodate medical diets and work in partnership with parents to ensure these needs are met. As part of the Trust's commitment to sustainability, we regularly review food miles and continue to work to reduce food waste.

Parents/Carers can pay for school meals using ParentPay.

Pupils entitled to free meals are allowed to purchase food to the value of a free school meal allowance daily.
